A manilla envelope containing three cassette tapes and one journal from 1976 unravels MA student Erin Zeigler's entire thesis before her dissertation defence. The story of a woman and her gynecologist lover leaves Erin with a burning question she cannot get out of her mind, even in her dreams: Who is "Darling"?

Using various media (sound, video, performance, and interactive pedagogical technology), this production explores the archive of a woman from the past known only as "Darling." Through this process, the diary and cassettes—materials from the past—begin to resonate with Erin's present.

After Erin, performed by Jenn Addesso, discovers this archive, she becomes consumed, pondering what it reveals about the role of professional women in society, gender norms, relationships of power—then and now—and the promise of love in a transgressive relationship.

In our consideration of the enigmatic Darling, we hope to inspire questions and collaboration with the audience about relationships, desire, and whether it's possible to be completely satisfied with the path one's life has taken.
