SUZUKI/VIEWPOINTS/COMPOSITION (July 6 to July 20)

Lyndesfarne Theatre Projects is hosting two of North America, Europe, and Japan's leading theatre practitioners of Suzuki, Viewpoints, and Composition: Ellen Lauren (Associate Artistic Director, Saratoga International Theater Institute – SITI) and J. Ed. Araiza (SITI Company Member). Anne Bogart is the Artistic Director of the New York City based SITI Company, which she founded along with Japanese director Tadashi Suzuki in 1992. The twelve day intensive workshop will be held in the beautiful hall of St. Mark's Church in Niagara-on-the-Lake, Ontario, from Sunday, July 6 to Friday, July 20, 2008.

Lyndesfarne Theatre Projects is an incorporated non-profit, registered charity and takes pride in its professional development programming. This is the third visit by Ellen Lauren and J. Ed. Araiza, and the first 12 day intensive workshop taught by the artists for Lyndesfarne.

RHIZOME (July 22 to July 27)

The Summer Intensive finishes with a 6-day workshop in RHIZOME training instructed by David Fancy. RHIZOME actor training is a vital, dynamic and open-ended system that combines a variety of specific influences. These include, but not are not limited to, late-Stanislavski psychophysical acting; insights from Grotowski's Theatre of Productions; and Yat Malmgrem's elaboration of Rudolph Laban's work on effort action and motion factors. The integrative work is emotionally, physically, and spiritually demanding/rewarding. It is designed to increase both the scope and detail of the actor's understanding and experience of the self-conception of their organism (bodily imaginary). Participants increase in range and specificity their capacity for spontaneity, clarity of expression, play, and engagement with a role in the context of a company of performers. The various fundamental connectives at the heart of the actor's process, stimulus, impulse, intention, action, and contact, are explored in depth. These anchors are combined in a finely-tuned, generative and creatively explosive rhizomatic environment that privileges risk-taking, the harnessing of fear, and the exploration of theatre's enduring potentials as a medium for human expression.
