Themes to consider in developing your
scenario:

- the young hero or heroine's journey
- issues of the North
- celebrating culture(s) and youth
- traditional and contemporary story
telling
- stories of real people and mythology
- your own ideas and passions
- the themes of the games:
Dream, Achieve, Inspire.

To enter the competition, writers
should submit a short bio, contact
information, a synopsis of the play they
propose to write, and 20 pages (type-
written) of sample dialogue to:

The winning proposal will be chosen by mid April, 2009, and the contestants notified once the winning playwright has agreed to participate in the development process. This process will include mentoring by Native elders, writing several drafts of the play, having the play workshopped at GPRC, and the final production of the play, which will be presented at the beginning of the Arctic Winter Games in March, 2010.
