Assistant Professor, Nine-Month Limited-Term in Acting

The University of Windsor's School of Dramatic Art seeks applications for a Nine-Month Limited-Term position in **Acting** at the rank of Assistant Professor commencing August 1, 2013. This position is subject to final budgetary approval.

The School of Dramatic Art at the University of Windsor is one of the oldest and best established theatre and drama programs in the country. Our graduates have made a mark on both the world stage and in film, as well as in education. Currently Dramatic Art offers honours degree programs in Acting, Drama in Education and Community, and Dramatic Art, and a wide ranging subscription season of plays through University Players that serve the community. The School of Dramatic Art operates in a state-of-the-art facility, which opened in July 2003 and contains spacious studios for Acting, Voice, Movement, and Drama in Education and Community, and a flexible-seat Studio Theatre. All studios are equipped for video-conferencing, sound, and have computer connections for power point delivery. University Players, the acting company of the School of Dramatic Art, also operates a 322 seat main stage in Essex Hall. The City of Windsor has a vital and expanding cultural community and we are within easy driving distance to Stratford, Toronto, Detroit, and Chicago. Boundless opportunities exist to explore and expand creative potential within both the University setting and the community.

Responsibilities will include the teaching of acting in the BFA Acting program as well as directing of main stage productions. Additional teaching responsibilities include teaching works- in-progress and other areas of the candidate's expertise. Applicants must have an MFA in Acting and/or Directing or demonstrated significant professional experience equivalent to an MFA in acting and/or directing. Experience with heightened text and classical work will be an asset. It is essential that the incumbent have significant current experience in acting and/or directing in professional theatre.

Applications will include:

- a letter of application, including a statement of citizenship/immigration status;
- a detailed curriculum vitae;
- statements of teaching interests and creative activity interests;
- sample of creative and/or scholarly work;
- sample course outlines (actual or proposed);
- teaching evaluations or other evidence of teaching effectiveness;
- and three current letters of reference forwarded by the referees.
