



## Tenure Track Position: Creative Technologies – Visual Applications

The Faculty of Fine Arts at the University of Regina, a dynamic team of creative scholars, is focusing on building capacity in the interdisciplinary area of Creative Technologies. We invite applications for a tenure-track appointment in Creative Technologies with a emphasis on Visual Applications at the rank of Assistant Professor to participate in shaping the continued development of this exciting area of creative research and teaching. The position will commence July 1, 2014.

Responsibilities of the position include teaching Fine Arts interdisciplinary courses in the area of Creative Technologies with a focus on visual applications. Teaching will include both studio-based and lecture format. Course offerings may include but are not limited to new media; intermedia; media arts; kinetic sculpture; sensor-driven interactive and wearable technologies systems; and digital and augmented performance at the undergraduate and graduate levels in the Faculty of Fine Arts. Teaching experience is an asset. Supervision of graduate and undergraduate student work; service on department, faculty, and university committees; and participation in faculty, university, and community life will be expected.

The successful candidate will have a strong research program and an active record of research dissemination in Visual Applications of Creative Technologies, and will have the opportunity to become a research partner/ associate of the New Media Studio Lab (NMSL). Applicants should have a doctorate in a related discipline, and/or a terminal degree in a Fine Arts discipline.
