Description

The School of Theatre + Dance seeks a dynamic director who will provide a combination of visionary and practical leadership for our diverse programs in theatre, design and production, and dance. Working with faculty, staff, and students, the next director will optimize the potential of the momentum currently defining the University of Florida's evolution and help shape the future of the SoTD as part of a preeminent, top-ten, comprehensive, land-grant research university and College of the Arts.

The University of Florida College of the Arts intends to be a transformative community, responding to and generating paradigmatic shifts in the arts and beyond. As artists and scholars, we embrace the complexity of our evolving human experience and seek to empower our students and faculty to fearlessly shape that experience through critical study, creative practice, and provocation. We seek a colleague who identifies as a change maker. We seek a colleague who will prepare students to access and unsettle centers of power in a radically changing world. We seek a colleague who will position emerging artists and researchers as catalysts for equity on local and global levels.

We are looking for a leader who will be a champion of the arts in a comprehensive research context, one who will support and facilitate a culture of curiosity, experimentation, and growth in theatre, dance, design, and production. We are looking for a leader who works with transparency, diplomacy, and inclusivity. We seek an effective manager, one with capacity to lead with efficient, effective, and thoughtful processes related to curriculum, fiscal management, and program growth in relation to the School's mission and values. We seek a candidate who is highly communicative and who can be a connector of people and ideas to build collaborative potential in a top-ten research institution and in our local, national, and international communities.

The ideal candidate will have a record of success in the development and implementation of effective systems that foster diversity, equity and inclusion. That person will likewise have a record of successful strategic planning, budget management, curriculum



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development, student and faculty recruitment, and guiding faculty through tenure and promotion processes, as well as a commitment to shared governance and the professional development of faculty and staff. Moreover, that person will possess the ability to represent and advocate effectively for the school locally, nationally, and internationally.

The light-filled, state-of-the-art Nadine McGuire Theatre and Dance Pavilion is home to the School of Theatre + Dance (SoTD). The School's international full-time faculty of 27 recognized artists and researchers are complemented by adjunct and guest faculty and staff, including full- and part-time professionals. The School offers MFA curricula in acting and in design/technology, which includes scene design, lighting design, and costume technology; BFA programs in acting, musical theatre, scene design, lighting design, and costume design; and a BA in general theatre. The School features two degree programs in dance designed to develop the individual voice of the dance artist, a BFA and a BA.

Approximately 200 students major in the artistically diverse curricula of the School of Theatre + Dance. Through its production program, outreach, and innovative programming, the School of Theatre + Dance provides multiple cultural opportunities annually to thousands of members of the University and the greater community. The University of Florida is accredited by the Southern Association of Colleges and Schools Commission on Colleges and is an accredited institutional member of the National Association of Schools of Dance and the National Association of Schools of Theatre. Applicants must hold a distinguished record of achievement in theatre, dance, design and production, or a related field, and a terminal degree or professional equivalency that merits a tenured appointment at the rank of full professor.

Applicants also should demonstrate:

- Leadership or administrative experience at a higher education institution
- Evidence of success in promoting an environment that advances diversity, equity, and inclusion
- A history of effective support of students, faculty, staff, and administrators, and
- A commitment to shared governance

Preferred Qualifications

The successful candidate will bring to the position:

- Demonstrated success as a chair/director, assistant/associate director, or comparable experience as a theatre and/or dance administrator
- Proven skills in budget management
- A record of successful arts advocacy in the public or private sectors
- A record of securing external funding
- Evidence of effective recruitment and retention of students and faculty

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- Experience in leading strategic planning and accreditation processes
- Experience at a large public university
- A commitment to innovative and cross-disciplinary programs
- Experience leading curricular change, and
- A vision for the future of Higher Education in the Arts and in Theatre and Dance specifically

Application Instructions

Materials must include the following: (1) a concise letter of application of up to two pages; (2) a curriculum vitae; (3) up to three links to work samples or evidence of professional success (i.e., artistic, leadership, advocacy, or diversity, equity and inclusion initiatives); and (4) a list of three professional references. The letter of application should address leadership style, accomplishments in the development and implementation of effective systems that foster diversity, equity, and inclusion, as well as an example of successful arts advocacy or strategic planning.

The search committee may request additional materials, including confidential letters of reference, later.

The search committee will review applications upon their submission. Full applications submitted by **December 2, 2018** will receive best consideration. Applications received after December 2, 2018 may be considered at the discretion of the committee and/or hiring authority.
