Applicants should have an ongoing program of research and specialize in teaching in teaching the studio-based areas of devised theatre and performance creation, with additional teachable strengths in movement for the stage, improvisation, and/or clown seen as assets. Previous experience teaching lecture classes in theatre and performance history and/or contemporary Canadian performance is strongly preferred.

The successful candidate must be suitable for prompt appointment to the Faculty of Graduate Studies. The position may involve graduate teaching as well as undergraduate teaching. Pedagogical innovation in high priority areas such as experiential education and technology enhanced learning is preferred.
