February saw Dr. Stuart Edmonds visit us with news on the ongoing research efforts that Prostate Cancer Canada funds throughout the year. Numerous research projects are underway in universities, hospitals and labs across Canada. This broadens our knowledge of the disease and how to more effectively detect and treat it. In this regard, Canada is one of the leading research countries in the world of prostate cancer.

In the past, many researchers kept their findings to themselves until they were published. A new era of collaboration is being fostered to make sure that all research findings are made available to other researchers. This can further their research and minimize duplication of effort.

Research projects undergo close scrutiny and peer level review to make sure that the research is continuing to make progress in order to secure ongoing funding.

Research Grants are divided into several categories:

- Discovery Grants to pursue new ideas.
- Team Grants to fund larger group projects.
- Rising Stars to provide partial funding and salary to researchers that have shown early promise in the field.
- Trainee Awards to encourage new graduate students to get involved early on with prostate cancer research.

All of these approaches are necessary to ensure that prostate cancer research continues to attract good people.

Tweed is a licensed marijuana producer, based in Smith Falls, ON and approved by **Health Canada** to supply medical cannabis to individuals with prescriptions. "Better by Tweed" offers locations in Hamilton, Guelph and Etobicoke that provide free information and support to anyone going through the process of accessing medical cannabis.

Breanne's role is to provide information to interested groups in Southwestern Ontario. Her presentations to **PCCN Oakville/Mississauga** and **PCCN Waterloo-Wellington** were both very well received. The focus of these sessions

was reviewing the process of accessing cannabis as an alternative (or additional) treatment to manage the symptoms of treatment or of the disease itself.

Prostate Cancer Canada Research: From Discovery to Impact by Dr. Stuart Edmonds, *Vice President Research, Health Promotion and Survivorship* at Prostate Cancer Canada

Dr. Edmonds joined Prostate Cancer Canada in February, 2012. Since then, he has spearheaded the launch of the **Research Strategic Plan**, providing the direction for research and survivorship activities for 2012-2015. From this plan, PCC has launched numerous new research programs based on the key pillars: Collaboration, Innovation and Talented People. Dr. Edmonds has also instituted a fair and transparent peer review process to steward and safeguard funds raised in support of prostate cancer research and to ensure that only the most promising, high quality research is funded.

Dr. Edmonds presented in considerable detail the process by which Prostate Cancer Canada determines which research and researchers to support with the funds provided by Movember, the government and support groups and individuals such as ourselves. They review numerous proposals throughout the year and try to support those with the most promise as well as supporting up and coming researchers. This multi-pronged research strategy also encourages researchers to collaborate and share their findings to support one another and maximize results across the country. Among the goals of the research is improved early detection and improved personalized treatment methods to further improve survival rates as well as limiting treatment to patients with potentially aggressive tumours. One indication as to the effectiveness of this ongoing research is the following press release:

On February 1, **Rocco Rossi, *President and CEO of Prostate Cancer Canada*** announced that **Dr. Paul Rennie** and **Dr. Artem Cherkason** have developed “...a new prostate cancer treatment that has consistently demonstrated in a lab setting that it provides a new line of defense against even the most aggressive, resistant cancers.
“This particular treatment has shown so much promise that the pharmaceutical industry has deemed it worthy of moving into clinical trials. This may be the lifeline men with drug-resistant cancer have been waiting for. It’s a real game changer, and I’m proud to say: This life-saving breakthrough is based on research people like you helped fund through Prostate Cancer Canada!”
