Next General Meeting, Tuesday, October 11th, 2016 - 7:00pm

Dave Cook, local historian and author of "Fading History". Dave's family lived near the Junction area of Toronto in the 1940s before they moved to establish a farm on the 6th Line, south of the Village of Malton. His family homestead was expropriated by the Federal Government in 1956 as part of the Toronto Airport expansion. The family then moved to Applewood Acres in south Mississauga.

In 1966 Dave was hired by CHIC Radio in Brampton and later accepted a job in the lucrative Toronto market at CHIN Radio. He was employed as an on-air news announcer. He left radio in 1974 to work as a newspaper reporter with The Mississauga News and later, its sister publication, The Etobicoke Gazette.

In 1980 he was elected Councillor, City of Mississauga and Regional Municipality of Peel and served three terms and retired in 1988.

After retiring from Council, Dave's lifelong hobby in motorsports led him into a new career as he accepted a job as general manager of Mosport International Speedway. When the race track was sold to a U.S. promoter he retired from motorsport and turned his attention to writing and publishing books on community history. Dave was presented with the Heritage Mississauga Foundation Award in 2009 and two years later was named a Paul Harris Fellow of Rotary International.

Outline of presentation:

"My presentation will cover a brief outline of the many stories I write about in my books. Topic range is from sports to royalty. All stories originated in the western areas of the GTA. Many of the topics are of international significance known the world over but took place in the Milton, Mississauga, Port Credit and Etobicoke areas. I write and talk about the Last Grand Duchess of Russia, the Lancaster Bomber, AVRO Arrow and Flying Saucer. I tell about Franklin Roosevelt's top secret train trip with his war cabinet through Niagara, Hamilton, Oakville, Mississauga, Etobicoke and on to Manitoulin Island and then what took place there that resulted in a military tribunal. I will tell about my neighbour Col. Harlan Sanders of KFC fame, I talk about some of the interesting, and humorous happenings during my research." – Dave Cook

Last General Meeting, Tuesday, September 13th, 2016 - 7:00pm

We began our 2016-2017 season of meetings with a review of the summer's awareness activities, culminating in **Cruisin' for a Cure** on September 11.

Health issues and mechanical problems led us to cancel several of our regular summer car show and race track appearances. But we had supporters like **Neila Boniface**, **Wes Manwell**, **David King**, **Terry Palmer**, **Lorne Bland** and **Bob Perkins**, all car buffs who have supported Cruisin' for many years, out distributing our show flyers and posters at every opportunity.

We were able to report that 5,000 flyers and 300 posters were distributed and that show attendance showed their effectiveness: 500+ vehicles came out and 287 blood tests were provided. We saved a substantial amount by changing our laboratory service this year. In addition to lower costs, the check-in procedure was much simpler than in previous years.

We do not have final numbers for high PSA scores or for revenue and expenses, but expect to be able to make a final report later in October or early in November.

It had been our intention to repeat the successful Stop, Start, Continue format for the balance of the September meeting, but **Morris Rambout** asked a leading question: "*If you had it to do over again, would you have the same treatment?*"

This led to a spirited discussion of the side effects or lack thereof that members had experienced and to discussion of the many improvements that have been made to traditional treatments and of newer treatments that were not available when we were diagnosed.

It seemed that all who spoke believed that they did make the best decisions possible given the information and alternatives available at the time that they were diagnosed. Very few major regrets were expressed.

This was one of the best meetings that we have had in quite a while with a high level of audience participation. Perhaps we have gotten over the shock of the new meeting location and we will see attendance improve over last year.

Members were interested to hear that we have some unusual speakers in mind for this year, starting with historian **Dave Cook** in October.
